




- Collectively define and unpack what LT-LEDS operationalisation means from a policy and investment perspective, including socio-economic and just transition considerations

One size doesn't fit all



Existing approaches

LT LEDS

Socio-economic analysis and a just transition focus (distributional effects, social protection, green jobs, trade flows, debt management, tax revenues etc.)



Policies and regulatory measures for new business models (e.g., energy tariffs, horizon for emission-free vehicles, forest protection, taxonomies, financial disclosure, etc.)



Public finance instruments (e.g., budget, tax incentives, public procurement, PPPs, green bonds, disaster risk instruments, etc.)



Investments plans and Partnerships for investments at scale (e.g., JET-P, policy-based loans, etc.)

Emerging considerations

- More difficult, yet essential, conversations: Political buy-in across government and society requires enhanced consideration of concerns and objectives of sectors and constituencies.
- Multiple leaderships and coherence: operationalization requires a combination of actions across several fronts. Balancing integration vs fragmentation to seek overall efficiency.
- 3 Systemic reforms and short-term results: keeping an eye both in delivering reforms across sectors and at the same time deliver investments, balance might vary from country to country.
